At the January Decatur City Council Meeting, the council approved the recommendation to increase Dove's contract for COVID-19 rent and utilities assistance with an additional \$300,000. This funding from the City of Decatur is only available to residents and will be distributed through Dove Financial Assistance Program.

Through the end of 2021, Dove has expended over \$400,000, helping 160 families with rent and utilities. There is a particular need for the working family that must stay at home with their children because of COVID

exposure or due to having COVID. We see families who live paycheck to paycheck so losing even a week's income puts them behind. For families who have multiple children this is particularly hard when you must take off work multiple times. We have talked to landlords who have also struggled during this pandemic but continue to try to work with their tenants to keep them housed. These funds can help ease this burden on landlords as well.

#### **Program Guidelines**

- 1. Eligible applicants may receive rental and mortgage assistance up to 14 months (includes 2 months paid forward).
- 2. Eligible applicants may receive power/utility assistance up to 12 months, excluding water.
- 3. Each eligible household may be funded not to exceed \$15,000.
- 4. Eligible residents must reside within the City of Decatur, IL corporate limits.
- 5. Eligible applicants may only receive assistance from one agency for one time period, other assistance can be received for other time periods from other agencies.
- 6. Eligible applicants must show proof of hardship.
- 7. Eligible applicants must not exceed the City of Decatur's FY 2021 Median Family Income based on statistical calculations by U.S. Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
- 8. Assistance must result in applicant staying in their housing for a minimum of 60 days.
- 9. Landlords are eligible to apply for assistance.

- Utility bill
- Landlord Certification (part of the application)
- Landlord Agreement (part of the application)

- WNCF matches customer payments (within the last 45 days) up to \$350 during heating season and up to \$200 during cooling season
- Heating grants are based solely on income guide-lines while cooling grants are intended for seniors, disabled or those with medical conditions exacerbated by heat (with a doctor's letter)

# from the Domestic Violence Program

February has brought with it the wrath of winter. Dove in Decatur has been powering through it and staying strong. Our staff is extraordinary and shelter services don't stop for weather. Know that if you are in an unsafe situation, no matter what the weather, there is a compassionate and strong group here to support and assist Domestic Violence Victims.

As of the 1<sup>st</sup> of March, all classes have resumed. This includes DV 101, Healthy Families/Parenting, Overcoming Trauma, Overcoming Addiction and Domestic Violence support group. Please call for schedule or check our website.

And shout out to Dove staff member Maddie Meyer. Maddie, our Prevention Educator spent February out in the community giving presentations to students at various schools within our service area. February was Teen Dating Violence Awareness Month, and she did a fantastic job.

### Moultrie County Becky Comstock, Coordinator

At Dove, our services are free and confidential. Our Domestic Violence advocates respect confidentiality. All discussions occur in private, and no information is ever shared. Advocates listen and believe victim's experiences and acknowledge their feelings. They let victims of domestic violence know they are not alone.

- A Dove advocate acknowledges injustice and lets their victims know the violence perpetrated against them is not their fault.
- A Dove domestic violence advocate informs people of their rights and options and respects their right to make the decision that best suits their situation and life because they know the victim is the expert of their own life.
- A Dove domestic violence advocate can help a victim safety plan and find them a safe place to go if they need to escape in an emergency.
- A Dove domestic violence advocate knows the resources in their community and provides victims access to available programs.

We empower victims, survivors, and their children to ensure they live a happy and healthy life free from abuse. No one deserves to be abused. If you or someone you know is experiencing abuse and in need of advocacy, please call the hotline at 217.728.9334.

Moultrie County Dove office accepts donations of toiletries and hygiene products. Such as: shampoo, conditioner, soap, body wash, deodorant, razors, feminine hygiene products, toothpaste,

& toothbrushes. Victims of domestic violence are often forced to leave their home due to the violence and have no choice but to leave all their belongings. We also accepts donations of baby items, such as: diapers, baby powder, baby wash & wet wipes. Baby items can often be expensive, and victims of domestic violence often rely on their abuser's income, especially after just having a baby. Things like finding employment, getting court ordered child support or getting TANF can take some time, SNAP benefits will not cover the cost of these items, so we keep them on hand.

Group services are currently being held on Thursday evenings at 5:00 p.m. Dinner is provided. Those wishing to attend or know someone who could benefit from group services should call 217.728.9303.

## DeWitt County Jennifer Tolladay, Coordinator

The Dewitt County office hours are 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. We are offering the DV101 for those interested in learning about the dynamics of domestic abuse, we offer counseling and assistance with filling out, filing and going to court for Emergency Orders of Protection.

# **RSVP Volunteer Opportunities**



**Rock Springs** has plenty of options available for volunteers, and they're open seven days a week for those who wish to serve. To volunteer contact Jenny Garver at 217.423.7708.

#### Highlights:

- In April, they will need volunteers for both their Festival of Spring and the Rock Springs River Ramble.
- Trail Monitoring Monitors don't have to stick to any particular schedule; anytime the Conservation District is open, you can walk one of the trails and mark on a sheet of paper where debris may have fallen, where benches and bridges need repaired, etc. Nothing like being able to volunteer for your community AND get some fresh air and exercise at the same time!
- Prairie Heritage- If you have an interest in history, Rock Springs can use volunteers to help teach about life on the prairie during the days before the Civil War. You get to dress up in period-typical clothes and show kids what life was like in the days long before things like cell phones and computers existed.
- There are plenty of other opportunities for those who like to work with their hands to build things, to garden, play baseball, paint, take pictures of wildlife, lead hikes, and assist with canoeing and fishing programs.

#### Faith in Action/Catholic Charities

Faith in Action assists seniors 55 and older who are homebound. Those interested in volunteering should contact Sarah Sanchez at 217.428.0013.

#### Highlights:

- Transportation People interested and eligible would take seniors to and from appointments, help them by doing some grocery shopping for them, etc.
- Friendly Visits Just going in and visiting with someone to make their day a little brighter often helps ease stress and loneliness, especially for those who don't have any family nearby.
- BINGOcize—A ten-week commitment, eligible volunteers spend two times a week at an assigned site such as an assisted living facility, where you play BINGO with the participants. To mix things up, you ask them a mix of questions on fall prevention and do short exercises to help them improve strength, balance, range of motion, and to stay socially engaged.
- Meals on Wheels Volunteers deliver meals to homebound individuals. They are in desperate need of more drivers.

# **News from Homeward Bound**

Staff have been working to engage and house 23 individuals who have been literally homeless (in a shelter, on the streets or somewhere unfit for human occupancy, such as an abandoned building) for 90-days or more. Six of those individuals meet the chronically homeless criteria, which means they have a diagnosable disability AND have been homeless for at least 1 year or have been homeless 4 times in the past 3 years, totaling 365 days.

There are 872 total participants currently receiving housing and/or services.

The need for 1-bedroom units for single individuals is still dire!
