


NCOA'S DATA VISUALIZATION TOOL

Eviction Moratorium

Erin Duncan, Staff Attorney at Prairie State Legal Services (McLean, Livingston, and Woodford counties), shared the resource below to assist individuals facing eviction. Feel free to share with clients. If clients receive a first appearance notice to go to court, they can meet with Prairie State at the courthouse on the Wednesday morning eviction docket (check with your local office). Contact Erin at eduncan@pslegal.org if you have questions about the status of the moratorium or to get connected with an office in your county.



The Illinois eviction moratorium is ending!

• Beginning August 1, 2021, any eviction case can be filed in court. But most eviction orders against "covered persons" cannot be enforced until September 19, 2021.*

You are a covered person if you have given your landlord a **written Declaration** that says:

- 1. You made no more than \$99K in 2020 (\$198K for couples filing jointly);
- 2. You are behind on rent due to COVID;
- 3. You're using your best efforts to make partial rent payments; and
- 4. You would be homeless or have to double up if evicted.

Your landlord must give you the Illinois Declaration form, or you can get the Declaration form online at <u>www.ihda.org</u>.

*If you pose a direct threat to the health and safety of other tenants or an immediate and severe risk to property, you can be evicted now even if are a covered person.

Applications take some time to process. You may also try contacting other local agencies, such as Catholic Charities or Salvation Army, to request help.
- Residents of many counties can call 2-1-1 for information about rent assistance resources (visit www.illinois211.org for more information).
- If you live in income-based housing and your income has changed, ask the landlord or the Housing Authority to "recertify" your income.
