The Illinois 13 Area Agencies on Aging served 478,113 adults aged 60 and over during FY 2024 or 16.5% of the senior population. Since the 1970s, each Area Agency on Aging has helped to build a network of aging services at the local level, incorporating the preferences of local participants.

Aging services assist older adults, their caregivers, grandparents raising grandchildren, people with disabilities, and veterans. The Area Agencies continued the initiative to reduce social isolation among older adults and their caregivers during 2024.
